- **Patient forms:** Please **complete these at home & bring them with you.**
- **Your Insurance Card/s and Drivers License/Photo ID.**
- **List of Current Medications.**
- **Your Family Doctor's Name, Address, Phone Number AND Referring Eye Doctor's Name (if you were referred) and eye drops (if any).**

Setting expectations for your visit:

- You will receive a very thorough, comprehensive eye exam and a variety of testing, based on your needs, and could be in the office for up to **2 - 2 ½ hours.**
- We will be using eye drops to dilate your eyes (make the pupils larger) so the doctor can see into the back of your eye. Please bring your sunglasses with you, however, we can provide slip-in sunglasses for your convenience.
- Please **DO NOT wear contact lenses** to your visit.
- Please bring someone to drive you home, as your eyes may be sensitive to light for several hours after dilation, and we want you to travel safely.
- Your doctor will explain the results of your examination, any recommendations for treatment, and will take the time needed to answer your questions.
- We have provided a wealth of information about the eye, how it works, eye problems, eye procedures, and options for achieving your best possible vision....and **MUCH more on our website.** We encourage you to learn about your condition.

- **If you are scheduled for a Cataract or LASIK Evaluation:** DO NOT wear your SOFT contact lenses within 2-weeks of your visit and HARD contacts lenses within 4-weeks of your visit.
- **Please DO NOT wear perfume, cologne, fragranced lotions, or hair spray,** as many patients and staff are sensitive to fragrance.
- The Eye Center accepts Medicare and participates in most insurance plans. Payment for the portion of the fee not covered by insurance is expected at the time of checkout.
